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Asante Rogue Regional's South Entrance Reopens

The south entrance to Asante Rogue Regional Medical Center reopened on Friday, April 3, as construction wrapped up on the first phase of a project to renovate and reconfigure space adjacent to the entrance.



The south entrance was closed and access was limited for two weeks, as crews removed a temporary construction corridor and built a new ceiling above it. Construction is now complete on the new Cardiopulmonary and Cardiac Rehabilitation units. Cardiopulmonary Services is scheduled to open in its new space on Monday, April 13, and Cardiac Rehabilitation on Monday, April 27.

Construction crews will now turn their attention to the installation of a new, 3-Tesla MRI scanner for the Imaging Department, in space previously used by Cardiopulmonary Services. Project manager Mark Powell of the Asante Real Estate Department said that portion of the overall project will get underway April 14, with demolition work to clear space for the scanner.

Four parking spaces adjacent to the west entrance of Radiation/Oncology Services in the Dubs Building will be set aside as a construction staging area, he said.

Asante staff members, patients and visitors will be encouraged to avoid the construction area whenever possible. The construction work may be confusing to some patients and visitors who are unfamiliar with the hospital, and those overseeing the project have asked Asante employees to take the extra time necessary to help others find their way.

The entire south entrance construction project is expected to be completed before summer.
